

Mary Martin of New Sleaford

Mary Martin, Widow New Sleaford PROB 11/1544

This is the last Will & testament of me Mary Martin of New Sleaford in the County of Lincoln, Widow made this twenty second day of March 1810. I give & bequeath unto my son in law **John Alexander Gibson** and **Elizabeth** the wife of John **Lord** of New Sleaford aforesaid Joiner & Cabinet maker whom I do hereby make, constitute & appoint Exor & Executrix jointly of this my said Will all & singular my personal estate whatever ???? consists of stock in the funds or of any other nature or fund whatsoever or wherever upon this Special Trust & confidence that they the said Alexander Gibson and Elizabeth Lord shall & so as soon after my decease as the same shall be ????? attested either jointly or separately as they may occasion or may so requisite for that purpose sell and dispose of all and singular the aforesaid personal to the best advantage and after divesting out of the monies arising therefrom as much as will be sufficient to pay & discharge my debts, funeral expenses and all others which they may sustain & be put in carrying this my Will into execution to the then remaining surplus money arising from such sale as aforesaid in equal shares & proportions to & amongst my son's **William Martin, Griffin Martin**, my daughters **Mary** the Wife of the said Alexander **Gibson**, my daughter **Sarah** the wife of Edward **Julian** & my Grandson **William Martin** the son of John Martin deceased those several and respective receipts for the same to my said Exor & Extrix or either of them shall be a good & sufficient discharge & in Witness whereof I have to this my said last Will & Testament overruling all others by me at any time herebefore made set my name & seal the day & year aforesaid. Proved at London 25 May 1813 before the Worshipful John Daubney, Doctor of law and sworn by the oath of Alexander Gibson, one of the Exrs who in admin was granted being sworn to admin powers devised to Elizabeth Lord the wife of John Lord the other Exor.
