In the Name of God Amen I William Knutton of Blidworth in the County of Nottingham knowing the certainty of death and the uncertainty thereof Do make this my last Will and Testament as follows ffirst I resign my Soul to God who gave it entirely relying on his mercy through the merits and mediation of my Saviour Jesus Christ my Body to be buried in the Parish where I die with as little expence as may be as to my Worldly Estate wherewith God as pleased to bless me with I dispose on it in this manner I give to my Son John Knutton thirty Pounds also I give to my son William Knutton the Sum of two hundred Pounds Also I give to my Son in law Charles Jerrom the Sum of two hundred & fifty Pounds setting the Bond aside I gave him at their marriage Also I give to my daughter Hannah Knutton two hundred and fifty Pounds and to my Son Samuel Knutton I leave him my whole Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills at any time made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this twenty second of December in the Year of our Lord 1777 now still written by my own Hand and Sealed with my own Seal on a Sheet of Paper William Knutton
