

This is the last Will and Testament of me William Sandby of Clifton in the County of Nottingham Farmer first I direct my just debts funeral and testamentary Expenses to be fully paid and satisfied as soon as conveniently may be after my decease I give and bequeath to my servant William Mills my broad Wheel Waggon also the sum of one hundred pounds which several bequests I direct shall be given and paid to him in addition to any sum of sums of money I may owe to him at the time of my decease I give and bequeath to Benjamin Stokes of Worcester Grocer one hundred pounds and to Elizabeth Tomlinson and Deborah Tomlinson Spinsters the sum of twenty five pounds a piece which said several legacies I direct shall be paid at the end of twelve Calendar months next after my decease and that the same legacies and bequests And also the said annuity shall be paid free of any duty or tax payable in respect thereof And as to and concerning All the Rest Residue and Remainder of my ready money and securities for money Goods Chattels and Personal Estate of what nature or kind soever subject to the Payment of the Duty or Tax payable in respect of the aforesaid Annuity Legacies and Bequests I give and bequeath the same unto my nephew William Storer his Executors Administrators and Assigns absolutely And lastly I nominate and appoint the said William Storer sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me at any time heretofore made In Witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand and seal this sixteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine Wm Sandby
